



NATIONALISM STUDIES PROGRAM

This program addresses issues of nationalism, self-determination, state formation, ethnic conflict, minority protection, language and citizenship rights, and constitutional design in modern and contemporary societies. It encourages critical and interdisciplinary approaches to the study of nationalism and provides students with a theoretical and methodological background in applied social sciences. Students may specialize in Jewish studies.

MASTER OF ARTS IN NATIONALISM STUDIES (ONE YEAR)

This program offers an interdisciplinary approach to the study of nationalism, drawing on relevant ideas from political science, history, anthropology, sociology, philosophy, and international relations.

MASTER OF ARTS IN NATIONALISM STUDIES (TWO YEARS)

Designed for applicants with a three-year bachelor's degree, this program encourages students to pursue open and critical perspectives in examining concepts of nationhood and nationalism as these relate to various fields including media, minority rights, and ethnic conflict.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY IN COMPARATIVE HISTORY OF CENTRAL, SOUTHEASTERN AND EASTERN EUROPE—NATIONALISM STUDIES TRACK

The doctoral program, offered through the Department of History, is designed for candidates pursuing careers in teaching and research. It emphasizes interdisciplinary and comparative scholarship that integrates social, cultural, economic, and political aspects of Central, Southeastern, and Eastern European as well as Ottoman and Middle Eastern history.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FELLOWSHIPS

CEU is committed to attracting talented students and scholars from around the world. The University provides a variety of scholarships and research grants for which applicants from any country are eligible to apply.

• CEU Master's Degree Fellowships

(full or partial) include a full tuition scholarship (with a value of €11,000 to €12,000), housing in the CEU Residence Center, and health insurance. Fellowship recipients also receive a monthly stipend to cover living expenses.

• CEU Master's Degree Tuition Scholarships

(full or partial) cover between 50 and 100 percent of tuition expenses up to €12,000 per year.

• CEU Doctoral Fellowships

cover full tuition, health insurance, and a generous stipend for housing and living expenses. More than 90 percent of PhD students receive the full doctoral fellowship.

• Direct Student Loans, Canada Student Loans

are available for eligible U.S. and Canadian citizens.

• External Scholarships, Financial Aid Programs

administered through CEU include Erasmus Mundus scholarships, Erasmus research grants, and other private and public fellowships and scholarships.
