This program addresses issues of nationalism, self-determination, state formation, ethnic conflict, minority protection, language and citizenship rights, and constitutional design in modern and contemporary societies. It encourages critical and interdisciplinary approaches to the study of nationalism and provides students with a theoretical and methodological background in applied social sciences.

The course examines the new manifestations of national populism from the perspectives of political science, sociology, law and history.*

Master of Arts in Nationalism Studies ONE YEAR / The program offers an interdisciplinary approach to the study of nationalism, drawing on relevant ideas from political science, history, anthropology, sociology, philosophy and international relations.

Master of Arts in Nationalism Studies TWO YEARS / Designed for applicants with a three-year bachelor's degree, this program encourages students to pursue open and critical perspectives in examining concepts of nationhood and nationalism as these relate to various fields including media, minority rights and ethnic conflict.

Certificate in Jewish Studies / Certificate in Religious Studies / The program also offers interdisciplinary concentrations in Jewish Studies and Religious Studies as a complement to master's degrees.
